From the desk of Rev. Lauren



Dear Friends in Christ,

Welcome to the Spring 2022 Crossroads newsletter! We are excited to, once again, revive St. George's newsletter, especially to share with our folks who aren't able to be with us in-person. The journey of communications, especially through Covid, has been challenging. Part of the reason was the frequently shifting and changing landscape of pandemic life and all keeping up with it required. Another part of the reason is that we have not, since shortly after I arrived, had a parish administrator for more than a few hours each week. Still, we did our best

to get things out in the mail and let our folks who are not online know that you are still a part of our community and we are thinking of and praying for you.

Upon our return to in-person worship services, we all noticed a gap between who frequently attended pre-Covid and who is attending now. For various reasons, many of our members have not yet returned. The pandemic isn't over yet and we've watched the ebbs and swells of the numbers for infections, hospitalizations, and deaths. It can make it challenging to decide how to move through our days, to say the least. If you are not with us, we miss you, we understand you aren't ready to come back yet, and our arms and hearts are open to you for when you do.

As we watch the numbers now in a steady decline and listen to the experts as they begin to ease up on restrictions, we are planning out into the year in high hopes that we're over the hump with the pandemic. We're looking ahead to gatherings through Lent and reviving some other events through the year. We hope to see more of you as the days get longer. Yet the effects of the past two years will be with us for some time. We've been through a collective trauma some of us have yet to begin processing. The way we saw the world respond when some of us did everything we could out of love and the interest of the safety of others impacted our faith. We're exhausted and that isn't going away any time soon.

So how do we proceed? Well, first I want you to know I am here for you. My door, physical or virtual, is open to you and I'm happy to schedule a meeting or phone call to talk, or just to listen. We've each had different experiences through Covid and I am not here to judge how you have or have not responded. Whether you are ready to come back or not, I am here. If you've lost faith in your fellow Christians or have new questions about what you believe, I am here. If you don't know how to process what you've experienced these last two years, I am here. If you aren't sure why you would want to return to church or are struggling with the idea, I am here. I am here. I will not try to convince you of anything; I will be present to you and meet you where you are. You can call, text, or email to connect with me.

I also want you to know that your St. George's leadership, in clergy and lay leaders, is moving through a process to be more effective, better live into our call as leaders in the church, and vision a way forward for the next chapter of St. George's life as a parish. This is a process that would've began more than a year ago had the pandemic not interrupted and turned things upside down. I am excited – and I hope you are, too – to engage in this work together as we seek to continue St. George's presence and service in Sanford and the surrounding areas. We've been here more than a century – longer even than Mrs. Bean! – so let's do what we can to live into where we are now and where we hope to be in the future.

May blessings be upon you this day and always.

September saw the return of our semi-annual fiftycent clothing sale. It went so well we held another sale in November and started talking about setting up an ongoing clothing closet for the community.




We had some fun dressing up for Halloween. One of our newest members won the costume contest as a ninja and Deacon Jean's dragon costume was a close second!
