Dear Friends in Christ,

The leaves fast are falling from the trees and hints of winter are blowing in with crisp breezes and morning frosts. May this Fall 2022 Crossroads bring some warmth with its memories of summer and familiar,

friendly faces.

This past year saw us continue making our way in this "post-pandemic" time, expanding our opportunities for gathering as a church as well as welcoming new twelve step and other community groups into our building. We've said goodbye to beloved members of our congregation as they've gone on to prepare the way for us. Our regular attendance, though lower than it was before the pandemic, has remained steady for many months now - enough that we made the bold move to return to two Sunday morning services.

Coming to church still feels hard for some of you. Seeing a smaller number gathered is one thing, but seeing the empty pews where those we love dearly once sat is a heart pain which cannot be measured. This little church has been through the wringer these past few years.

And yet. Since the first services of St. George's in Sanford, Maine were held in 1901, this church has remained through a fire, the closing of the mills, the Great Depression, several recessions, wars, and a rapidly changing society which seems to value the idea of church less and less. We are still here.

"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" Change, while often uncomfortable, is inevitable. Church as we long have known it is passing away. We, as the Body of Christ, have the opportunity to keep saying "yes" to God and loving and serving our neighbors, even as it shifts and changes all around us.

St. George's has amazing resources for our community. Keeping our little church going means hundreds of people served each week through programs and community groups. Keeping our little church going means having a sanctuary and worship services in which we can be present to God and each other. Keeping this little church going means keeping a spiritually grounded presence here on this corner of Main and Emerson Streets from where our prayers go out into the world.

The smiling faces and other photos in this newsletter are full of life. Let us tap into that energy and remember who we are – and who we are called to be.

"He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life?"²






