

Grace to you and peace!

The summer months are here in Maine. As of the first of June, there remained a rather significant pile of dirty, black snow next to the toll booth on the north bound entrance ramp to the turnpike in Kennebunk. It is now melted, however, it is a reminder of what we have endured.

I love the old Maine saying: "If you can't take the wintah, you don't deserve the summah!" Well, summah is here and we deserve it!

The months of June, July, and August usually bring a slower pace to life. It is hot, school is out, and many activities cease until September. The church calendar is not an exception to this reality. We are at the halfway point in our liturgical year.

Beginning with Advent, we keep a hectic pace from Christmas to Pentecost. The story of Jesus Christ "come among us" occupies the first six months of the liturgical year: birth, death, resurrection, and ascension/giving of the Spirit. Now the pace slows.

In the Episcopal Church we call this summer/autumn time "The Season After Pentecost". I like the Roman Catholic designation for these slower months: Ordinary Time. Indeed, no major feast days to celebrate and the altar is dressed in green for what seems like forever!

This time of "liturgical relaxation" does have merit. On Sundays our gospel readings often include the parables of Jesus. Each of the parables has a teaching to ponder. The scripture readings give the preacher a wealth of material to explore. It is my favorite time to preach.

I hope and pray that your summer will be pleasant, healthy, and relaxing. It is a good time to reflect on your spiritual journey and to rejoice at God's presence in your life.

Ash Wednesday




Lenten Suppers

 - Rev. Jean Cavanaugh is our Deacon. She is a lover of animals, people and life! Cofacilitator of a NAMI Peer Group meeting on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month at 6 p.m. in the church library. She is still discovering who and what a Deacon is and does.
- We Can't Have One Without the Other: Grief, Anger and Praise in the Psalms with Anna Youngmann Morrow
 - Anna is a pastor's kid with lots of mixed emotions about organized religion, and a lot of love for Jesus and a longing for faith community. She's attended St. George's for the last 3 years with her spouse. She works as a domestic abuse prevention educator and bakes on the side.

 - Eleanor is an Episcopal priest serving two congregations in the diocese of Massachusetts. She has been on a journey exploring forgiveness, both for herself, and as a Christian concept for about 15 years.
